- Utilize tools such as Adobe InDesign, Illustrator, and Acrobat, in addition to Canva and other platforms to produce publication-quality layouts suitable for distribution in both print and digital formats.

- Contributes to a work environment that encourages knowledge of, respect for, and development of skills to engage with those of other cultures or backgrounds.
