Regional Transportation Needs Survey

SMCOG – Jason Ray

The deadline to submit needs to be included in the transportation needs prioritization process is September 2nd. A brief overview of the prioritization process and time line was reviewed and is expected to be completed in November. MoDOT has requested a list of prioritized needs by January 20, 2017.

Jason Ray asked TAC members about their preference on a set meeting schedule versus calling meetings as needed. TAC members discussed options and decided to meet every other month on the third Wednesday of the month. According to this schedule, the next TAC meeting will be September 21.

Guest Reports

MoDOT – Frank Miller

The Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission is including an intersection cost share program in the STIP for the SW MoDOT District. This would be another cost share program in addition to the Missouri Moves program approved by the State Legislature. \$5.3 million will be available for the intersection cost share program; 50% of the funded improvements must be on the State system; there will be a workshop on September 9.

The intersection cost sharing program will be partnered with the Missouri Moves initiative for \$5.3 million. In order to receive the grant in its entirety 50% of improvement must be completed on a state route. On September 9th MoDOT will have a workshop to plan and prioritize.

MPO Updates
